Crime Trends

The following are the crime statistics representing 1/01/10–1/31/10:

During this rating period Burglary /Theft from Motor Vehicle (BFMV) has become a problem in 14A25 area. In the majority of the incidents the items of value were left in plain sight. Items of value left in plain sight inside your vehicle are a welcome mat for BFMV suspects to burglarize your property. Whenever your vehicle is unattended lock and secure all doors/windows. Also close all air vents. Do not use your glove-box to store items of value. It is the first place BFMV suspects look. Place all items in the truck of your vehicle and at the end of your day take all items inside your home with you. Join your local Neighborhood Watch Program. It is still the best

tool we have against crime. Contact your local police if you observe a crime in progress.

Safety Tip

Deadbolt locks safety tips:

All exterior doors, including the door to the garage, should have deadbolt locks installed on them. The bolts should reach inside the door frame at least one inch into the doorframe in the locked position, and should have a hardened steel insert to prevent anyone from sawing through it.
