

Gardening Tips: Trees and Hedges

Protect the tree trunk from weeds, grass and weed whackers – install a stone or plastic barrier approximately two feet or more around the tree.

If the hedge was installed less than two or three years ago, it

probably still has stakes to keep the shrubs upright. Check the green plastic ties, they are most like too tight now and prevent the shrubs from growing and staying healthy. If the stakes are still needed, simply remove and



replace the existing ties leaving "room" for the plant to grow. Do not use coated or non-coated metal wires.

When planting trees and woody shrubs, make sure not to bury the plant deeper than it was planted in the

nursery pot.
