# From The President's Desk:

Dear Neighbors,

I hope this newsletter finds you all well!

Our last neighborhood meeting was dedicated to the Santa Monica Airport pollution study, published by UCLA scientists. More than 160 neighbors showed up to learn more about the Ultra-Fine

Particles blown into our air from the jet airplane operations at Santa Monica Airport (SMO). Councilman Bill Rosendahl moderated the forum, which included a group of three scientists with varying experience and scientific study of the SMO. Councilwoman Jan Perry, Assemblyman Ted Lieu, representatives of Jane Harmon and Barbara Boxer, Kate Anderson and Marcie Winograd all attended the meeting.

It was very clear from the questions and remarks made by residents that frustration with the airport is at a high. The general feeling communicated is that our neighborhood is being ignored, and fighting the airport is perceived as hopeless.

The good news is that this is not the case. Councilman Bill Rosendahl, once again, made his clear his position that it is time for the airport to be shut down. At the end of the forum, Councilwoman Jan Perry announced she would lend her support to protect our neighborhood from further

harm.

In addition, Concerned Residents Against Airport Pollution, whom we hosted the forum with, has been working tirelessly to build on the momentum of the UCLA study and the forum. Please keep the momentum alive by staying involved. If we expect our elected representatives to support us, we need to stand up and be heard. Waiting for someone else to get involved is not going to get the job done.

Chocovivo offers a variety of chocolates. Patricia will help select the right ones for eating, baking or drinking.

If you've ever wondered how to prepare Thai broccoli, Chiuefuer Her of Central Valley Farm suggests the following simple recipe: steam the broccoli to the desired doneness; add a little lime juice and salt.



Burglary/Theft from Motor Vehicle (BFMV) has become a problem in our area. BFMV suspects gained entry to several of the vehicles via unsecured doors and windows. Lock and secure your vehicle anytime it is unattended. Never leave items of value in plain sight inside your vehicle, it only tempts BFMV suspects. Attempt to park in well lighted areas with heavy pedestrian traffic. Turn your wheels sharply to the left or right and set the emergency brake when parking. This makes it harder for thieves

to tow your vehicle. Join your local Neighborhood Watch Program, it is still the best tool we have to combat crime.

### **Safety Tip**

Valet safety tips:

Leave the attendant your vehicle key only; remove home, work and other keys. Do not say where you are going or how long you will be away. Note your mileage when you leave your vehicle.
