The following are the crime statistics representing 10/1/10 - 10/31/10:

During this rating period Burglary/Theft from Motor Vehicle (BFMV) has become a major problem in 14A25 area. Overall crime in several categories increased this period. BFMV increased the most. Stop leaving items of value in plain sight inside your vehicle. GPS, iPods, cell phones, etc. are all items that are typically left in vehicles which BFMV suspects thrive on. Place all items in your trunk and at the end of the day, take all items

out of your vehicle. Do not use your glove-box as a traveling safe; it is the first place a BFMV suspect looks. Join your local Neighborhood Watch program. It is still our best tool against crime.

Holiday trash safety tip:

Avoid leaving boxes from gifts and purchases (especially TVs, computers, ipods, etc. out at the curb or visible for trash pick-up. Doing so alerts criminals to what you may have in your home worth stealing.
