Monthly Farmers Market Report

Here's a list of what some of the vendors are recommending for March.

JR Organics: Swiss chard (it'll be green, leafy and juicy), beets and celery.

Rancho Padre Organic Fruit: Oro blanco grapefruit (a sweet yellow grapefruit), tangelos, blood oranges and tangerines.

Gloria's Fruits & Vegetables: Gaviota and Chandler strawberries.

Tradewind Mushrooms: Shiitakes, Chanterelles, Oyster and Portobello mushrooms. Also recommended are Matiake ("hen of the woods") mushrooms, a robust, earthy mushroom.

Central Valley Farm: bitter melon leaves, yam leaves, sugar snap peas.

Pudwell Berry Farm is a new vendor at the market selling raspberries, blackberries and blueberries.

Business) has continued to be a problem in 14A25 area. In the majority of incidents the victims continue to leave their home unsecured. Whenever you leave home, lock and secure all doors/ windows. Also lock all upper level patio doors as well as pet doors. Install window locks or pegs on all windows for extra security. Install sensor lights around your property, ample lighting helps deter burglary suspects. Keep shrubs and hedges trimmed. This will give intruders fewer places to hide. Join your local Neighborhood

Watch Program, it is still the best tool we have to combat crime. Contact your local police if you observe a crime in progress.
