What is a senior lead officer?

A senior lead officer (SLO) is an officer in charge of a basic car area within a geographic division. SLOs provide a link that help unite the LAPD with the communities it serves. They are responsible for monitoring crime trends in basic car areas, working with Community-Police Advisory Boards and acting as liaisons with detectives to stay informed of crime trends and special problems within their area. The SLO is often the main liaison for problem solving between the Department and the resident. Continuous interaction between the police and local residents is essential to enhancing the quality of life and deter crime within the neighborhood.

How To Recycle Your E-Waste And Keep Toxic Elements Out of Our Landfill!

E-Waste (Electronic Waste) is a popular, informal name for unwanted electronic products. Items such as computers, TV's, VCR's, stereos, copiers, fax machines and telephones are common electronic products that become unwanted as they are replaced by newer, more advanced products. Some of these unwanted products can be reused or refurbished. Non-profit, charitable organizations such as L.A. Shares, Goodwill Industries, the Salvation Army and St. Vincent de Paul may accept electronic products that are in good working condition or that may only need minor repairs in order to be reused. Contact these organizations directly for more information.

The Bureau of Sanitation has established a number of

permanent collection sites throughout the City, known as S.A.F.E. CENTERS which are open every weekend and provide a convenient way to dispose of your residential, household e-waste. Residents are limited to a total of six pieces per visit to a SAFE Center. Of the six pieces, no more than two pieces can be CRT-related. Small items (mouses, cables, modems, cell phones, etc.) can be packed in a carton box and that carton will be considered one item.

If your recipe calls for dried fruits, Avila Farms has dried apricots, plums, peaches, nectarines and raisins. They also have walnut meal, pecan meal as well as whole nuts. Visit Lelio and Sons for a varied selection of cheeses to serve at your Thanksgiving meal.
