Monthly Farmers Market Report

The fruits and vegetables available at the Mar Vista farmers market the past summer months should still be available through September. You should see pluots, nectarines and peaches for the next several weeks or longer. Z Ranch from the Imperial Valley expects to carry honeydew, cantaloupe and watermelon in September depending on the weather. They also hope to have corn for about another month.

The tables of Central Valley Farm hold an interesting array of vegetables including an assortment of eggplants: Thai, white and Philippine green and purple. They also carry Chinese bitter melon and black eyed peas. Ask the owner Chiuefuer Her about Sinqua, a vegetable with an interesting squash like shape and consistency. He'll give you tips on how to prepare it.

Be sure to visit Maria at Sunshine Sprouts. Try one of her best sellers which, a mix of lentils, sunflower seeds, pumpkin seeds and peas. Another popular item is sunflower greens. She also sells sweet pea sprouts and a selection of beans such as white navy, pinto garbanzos and mung beans.

The School Report: News & Events at Richland Avenue Elementary Reading and Math Test Scores Continue To Rise

A MSG FROM PRINCIPAL SALAZAR: RICHLAND AVENUE SCHOOL SHINES!

Congratulations to the Students, Parents and Staff at Richland Avenue! A preliminary look at our California Standardized Test scores for Spring 2009 show double digit gains in Reading at Third, Fifth and Sixth grades. In Math, students showed double digit gains at Third, Fourth and Sixth grades. The California Department of Education has delayed the API calculation until mid September. However, we anticipate that the increased number of students performing at proficient and advanced levels will be reflected in our 2009 API score. The focus for 2009-2010 will be to continue implementing the Cycle of Continuous Improvement to bring forth high quality teaching and learning for all students.

The first day of school for Richland Avenue will be Wednesday, September 9th. Upcoming events: On Saturday, September 12th the school will be hosting a Garden Day with Pepperdine volunteers 8:30am-noon in the school's Learning Garden.



During this rating period Burglary (Residential/ Business) has again become a problem in 14A25
