## **Monthly Farmers Market Report**

With March comes Daylight Savings and the first day of spring. Selling seedlings of unique varieties of vegetables and herbs, Home Grown Gardens reflects these changes as it transitions from cool season to summer crops. They are currently at the tail end of selling prima rosa swiss chard and broccoli rabe. In March look for early varieties of beans (dragon's tongue beans and fava beans) and tomatoes (early varieties such as glacier and black prince). Let Matt help you select your next harvest and answer any questions about caring for your seedlings.

Citrus will predominate for the next several months until the stone fruit make their appearance in May. For strawberry enthusiasts, some summer varieties have been available since the beginning of the year and will continue to sweeten through the spring. For those interested in Asian cooking, the Mar Vista Farmers Market provides ingredients such as baby bok choy, yu choy, Thai broccoli, asian mustard greens, ginger and lemon grass. You'll be able to find these products at Central Valley Farms and/or Fresno Evergreen Farms.
