## **Monthly Farmers Market Report**

As of the last Sunday in April, peaches have made their first 2013 appearance at the Mar Vista Farmers Market. Arnett Farms has yellow, white and white donut peaches. They are from the first picking, are small and will need a few days to ripen. While they don't have the great flavor they will in about a month, you can already taste the days of summer with these peaches.

Other first sightings at the market are zucchini: green, yellow and round varieties. In the next weeks be on the lookout for white corn, eggplant (including Chinese and Japanese varieties), peppers, green beans, long green beans and white long beans.

For your home garden, Elser's Country Farm is selling heirloom tomato plants, heirloom peppers and stevia (the natural sweetener). More information on how to use stevia is available on their Facebook page. Maria Elser expects to have plants available through June.
