Monthly Farmers Market Report

There are two new food vendors at the Mar Vista Farmers Market who share a single space. One of them is Truly Gourmet Ice Cream selling non-dairy, honeysweetened sorbets made from a coconut liquid base. The sorbets are hand made using the highest quality ingredients. Flavors available their first week at the market were lime, chocolate and coconut. Sharing the space is Market Burger. Here you can buy a grass-fed burger made from Dey Dey's Best Beef, Les Delice du Four's ciabatta roll, topped with lettuce, tomato and onion from The Garden of..., a true collaboration of the MVFM.

Be sure to visit Pomme Frites for authentic Belgian fries. Accompany your fries with one (or more) of the following sauces: chipotle mayo, pesto mayo, pineapple teriyaki, honey mustard, curry catsup, horseradish, to name just a few.

Jimenez Family Farm from Santa Ynez carries a great selection of produce which is grown using organic practices in a sustainable and environmentally friendly way. Some of their farm grown fruits are used in Marcie's Pies which are sugar-free vegan desserts (the crisps do contain butter). Their strawberry rhubarb crisp was chosen one of the top ten pies in LA County by the LA Weekly. Pies vary with the season, so expect to see pecan pies, pumpkin pies and the pie of the month: October's was apple rum raisin. Marcie makes her pies the day before they come to the market. Don't forget to reserve a pie for Thanksgiving.

During this rating period Basic Car 14A25 has continued to have a problem with Burglary (Business/ Residential) in our area. Overall crime has increased in almost all categories, but residential burglary has remained our biggest problem. Remember, never leave your home unsecured when you are not there. Leaving windows, patio doors and pet doors unsecure is a clear invitation for a burglary suspect. All doors and windows should be locked and secured, pet doors should also be locked. Do not leave upper level windows open, suspects can gain entry in unlikely places. Join your Neighborhood Watch Program, it is still the best tool against crime. If you observe any suspicious or criminal activities, call the police right away.
