NWNA PARKING TEAM

On April 14th the NWNA Parking Team gathered for a follow-up meeting to address concerns over some of the vehicles that park in our neighborhood; vehicles that do not always seem appropriate for our streets, aesthetically or for safety reasons. Examples would include vehicles that people are living in and vehicles that are "over-sized" and possibly hazardous. We were fortunate enough to have both Len Nguyen, a Senior Field Deputy from Council Member Mike Bonin's office, and Adrian Acosta, of the LAPD (our Area Senior Lead

Officer) join us to educate us and provide helpful insight on potential solutions.

Although City Code allows people to live in their parked cars in Los Angeles, we learned that we have the ability to restrict the parking of over-sized vehicles in our neighborhood. An over-sized vehicle is defined as being over 7 feet high, or over 22 feet long. RVs/campers are an example. A relatively easy way to create a basic restriction to reduce the number of campers and other unreasonably large vehicles from gathering next to our homes would be to ban over-sized vehicles from parking on our streets between the hours of 2am and 6am daily. This could be a very elegant solution to help minimize vagrancy and trash dumping in our neighborhood, and a basic improvement to the quality of our neighborhood without negatively impacting ourselves as residents.

Parking restrictions must be petitioned for and approved on a block-by-block basis. Therefore, we cannot achieve a blanket restriction for all of our neighborhood's streets with only one petition/application. And signatures from at least 2/3 of the residents/owners of a given block are required for an application to be considered by the city. To be truly successful we will need to have a representative from each block petition their fellow residents and submit the application for the permit.

Those of us who attended this meeting feel that this is a worthwhile effort. And we are grateful that Len Nguyen and Adrian Acosta were so helpful and supportive.

NWNA COMMUNITY ALERT: Pacific Division is reporting an increase in distraction burglaries in the boundaries of the 10 FWY to the North and Venice Blvd. to the South, Centinela to the West and Barrington to the East.

Suspect and tactic information from the April 20, 2015 police bulletin: A male Hispanic, (described as 20-25, 5'07"/5'10"), comes to the door and explains that he is installing a fence in the adjacent neighbor's yard and needs access for proper measurement. The victim then takes the suspect to the rear yard. While they are in the back additional suspects(s) enter the residence and take items.
