BURGLARY DISTRACTION THIEVES TARGETING THE ELDERLY

TEAMS OF DISTRACTION THIEVES HAVE RECENTLY BEEN VERY ACTIVE IN THE WLA AREA. THESE TEAMS INCLUDE MEN, WOMEN, AND SOMETIMES CHILDREN, IN VARIOUS COMBINATIONS. THESE GROUPS WILL APPROACH ELDERLY PEOPLE IN THEIR HOMES. THEY USE BOGUS EXCUSES TO GET INTO THE HOUSE, DISTRACT THE RESIDENTS AND TAKE MONEY AND JEWELRY.

PLEASE BECOME AWARE OF THE FOLLOWING SCENARIOS USED BY THE THIEVES TO GAIN ACCESS TO HOMES IN YOUR AREA. IF YOU ARE APPROACHED BY INDIVIDUALS TRYING TO GAIN ENTRY TO YOUR HOME, OR REQUESTING YOU TO EXIT YOUR RESIDENCE FOR SUSPICIOUS REASONS, REFUSE TO COOPERATE, AND CALL THE POLICE.

- #1. THE TEAM WILL CLAIM THAT THEY ARE LOOKING FOR THEIR CAT THAT "MAY BE IN YOUR BACKYARD". THEY WILL ASK YOU TO HELP THEM LOOK FOR THEIR CAT. WHEN YOU ARE OUTSIDE, A SECOND PERSON WILL ENTER THE HOUSE AND TAKE MONEY OR JEWELRY.
- #2. THE TEAM WILL TELL YOU THAT THEY WORK FOR A **UTILITY COMPANY (DWP OR GAS COMPANY)**. THEY WILL INDICATE THAT THERE IS A PROBLEM IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD THAT NEEDS REPAIR. YOU MAY BE ASKED TO ASSIST THEM. WHILE YOU ARE HELPING THEM, A SECOND TEAM MEMBER WILL ENTER YOUR HOME WITH THE INTENT TO BURGLARIZE.
- #3. THE TEAM WILL APPROACH YOU AND CLAIM THEY ARE A **CURRENT OR FORMER NEIGHBOR**. THEY WILL ASK TO BE INVITED INTO YOUR HOME. ONCE INSIDE, THEY WILL DISTRACT YOU BY ASKING FOR A GLASS OF WATER. WHILE YOU ARE OUT OF THE ROOM, A TEAM MEMBER WILL RANSACK THE HOME LOOKING FOR MONEY AND JEWELRY.
- #4. THE TEAM WILL APPROACH YOU AND CLAIM TO HAVE COMPLETED HOME REPAIRS (YOU DID NOT CONTRACT FOR) OR THEY WILL OFFER TO DO HOME REPAIRS SUCH AS ROOFING, FENCE REPAIR, OR TREE TRIMMING. THEY MAY ASK YOU TO STEP OUTSIDE TO DISCUSS WORK THAT NEEDS TO BE DONE (THEY MAY ASK FOR CASH UP FRONT). IN THIS WAY, THEY WILL DISTRACT YOU IN ORDER TO SEARCH YOUR HOME FOR MONEY OR JEWELRY.
- **#5.** THE TEAM WILL APPROACH YOU AND **CLAIM TO BE CAL TRANS WORKERS** OR OTHERWISE CLAIM TO HAVE REASONS TO TRIM THE BRUSH IN YOUR REAR YARD.

During this rating period Basic Car 14A25 (Mar Vista District) has experience an increase in Burglary (Residential/Business). The suspects committed their crimes at various times throughout the day. In the majority of the burglaries (Residential) the suspects gained entry via rear sliding glass win-

dows. If you have a home alarm system, arm and activate it anytime you are away from home. Place a rod or stick in the tracks of your sliding glass windows for extra protection. Install sensor lights around your property, burglary suspects detest lights for fear of being seen committing their crimes. Join your local Neighborhood Watch Group it is still the best tool we have against crime.

Safety Tip:

Attempt to park in well-lit areas with high pedestrian traffic. Avoid parking your vehicle in unattended parking lots. A vehicle is five times more likely to be broken into or stolen from an unattended lot than from the street or attended lot.
