# Cracking Up Is Not Always Funny Sidewalk Repair Update for North Westdale

The city of Los Angeles grades sidewalk conditions on a scale ranging from Unbelievably Very Bad (UBV) to Not Bad. Only the UBV are placed on the repair/rebuild list since the city does not have the funds to make all repairs

In our neighborhood, only National Boulevard between Federal

Avenue and Butler Avenue, and Barry Avenue between Brookhaven Avenue and Richland Avenue were graded as UBV. These two areas will be repaired by the city in the 2006-2007 fiscal year.

Coolidge Avenue (between Pearl Avenue and Richland Avenue) and Barry Avenue (between Pearl Avenue and Richland Avenue) were put in the Very Bad category. If funds are available, the city will also repair those areas, but we will not know until after July 3rd if there is money to repair them.

For all other areas, the city offers a 50/50 Program where the city and the homeowner split the cost of repairs. The necessary repairs can be done immediately. If you are interested, you should call Shelly at (818) 374-6857 and request an estimated.

Have you noticed the set of air quality monitors placed near the southwest corner of the Richland Avenue School schoolyard? The South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAOMD) is conducting a study to compare the air around Santa Monica Airport (SMO) and Van Nuys Airport to the air in the SCAQMD basin. It will monitor certain elements of the air for two, alternating, three-month periods by SMO as well as Van Nuys. It may sound good, but don't get vour hopes up. It won't be till next June before the results are available and the study is not designed to look at what we are most concerned about: and that is the odors of raw jet kerosene we so often smell throughout the day. There is another set of monitors set up at a residence in a cul-de-sac just east of the airport.

California State Assemblyman, Ted Lieu, has introduced legislation that would require the Santa Monica Airport to record the taxi/idle times of aircraft operations for one year and make the information available to the public monthly. The bill, AB 2501, passed through the full Assembly and will now go to Senate side of the California legislature. If the bill passes through the Senate and is then signed by the Governor, the data required could then be used in computer modeling studies to show the extent of kerosene odors and pollution into the surrounding communities. Modeling studies will be able to do what the SCAQMD study presently underway can't do. Since last November's Town Hall regarding Santa Monica Airport put on by Councilman Bill Rosendahl and CRAAP, the "Panel of Experts", assembled on stage, has held three meetings to determine the best approach to our airport impacts. The plans are for the Panel to meet one more time before we hold another Town Hall to give the public a progress report. The Town Hall will probably be in early October, 2006.

# Correction to March Newsletter

In the March "North Westdale News", one item represented in the list of current projects that NWNA members are working on was, "Arranging for airport pollution studies and lobbying airport and city officials to restrict jet traffic."
